Week 3 is Headcollar week and Roundings is the important new skill here. A dog collar and a pair of Pelham roundings will have you well prepared for the Throat. You will be shown how to cut the headcollar from a butt but can do most of the stitching at home as long as you know how to assemble.

Week 4 is Martingale week and new skills introduced include making a long taper on the body, straps with 3 keepers, putting a safe behind the ring on the body, switching from stitching on the front to stitching on the back on the martingale attachment, the shape of the wither piece and making this raised and stitched.

Week 5 is enhancing and applying the skills learned and preparing for and taking the skills test if you wish to gain the qualification.
